After some disastrous events of the past few months, I heartily recommend it to anyone living in a high rise or single family dwelling. it is very easy to arrange with your local department, and could save your life.

On a related subject, I was fortunate, recently, in being able to visit 9 fire stations in various parts of the United Kingdom – from Guernsey to Glasgow. One of the more interesting ones was the station on the Island of Guernsey in the Channel Islands. Expecting to find a small station on the Island of around 63,000 residents, at the peak of the very hilly capital City of St. Peter Port, was a most beautiful building with 8 bays containing a total of 9 fire appliances (4 water tenders, 2 water carriers, 1 aerial, 1 heavy rescue, 1 light striker plus 9 trailers carrying various miscellaneous equipment). It was pointed out that, aside from the airport, this station covered the whole Island of 24 square miles. Hopefully you will get to see some of my photos in future issues of The Third Alarm.

Finally, as Membership Secretary, I would be remiss if I did not remind our readers again of our need to find new members. If you know of anyone who is interested in the Fire Service and would like to join our organization, please have them get in touch with me. The Apparatus Floor....

Vaughan's new Station 73 officially opened on June 26, it's located at 7690 Martingrove Rd. in Woodbridge. In North Perth, construction will start on a new Monkton fire hall in mid-May 2017. The new building will be located on Nelson Street, just north of the current station. It will have three bays, and will be 542 square metres in size. The Counties of **Parkland and Yellowhead** in Alberta are working jointly to build a new fire station in Evansburg to replace Station 10. Negotiations are still underway, but the building is projected for completion in late 2017. Hanley-Rosedale, SK is building a new hall, projected completion is later this year. From Ken Buchanan, Brant County are building three replacement stations; Cainsville and Onondaga stations will be built on the sites of the old halls and the new hall for Scotland will be built in a different location, **Oakville** has acquired land on Rebecca St. at the site of the old arena was for the relocation of #3 Hall - Central Station.

Minden broke ground for a new multi-bay station on Highway 35, next door to the new EMS station. The \$1.9 million project will replace a 1973 station in town that was damaged in a flood in 2013. It is expected to be finished next spring.

Expected soon: Hamilton has received a new KME rescue. Brampton has no fewer than three trucks being built at Dependable: Two pumpers for Stations 202 and 206, and a rescue pump for 212. They also have an E-One tower on order.

Truck moves: with new apparatus deliveries, several services had made moves and disposed of older rigs: **Burlington**, with the arrival of Quint 331, has moved Pump 331 to 361 and is selling off 361's old unit.

Windsor Fire & Rescue placed its first rescue pumper into service in early June. It's a 2017 Rosenbauer Commander with 500 gpm pump, 500-gallon booster tank and 40 gallons of foam. The new Rescue 3 -which replaces a 2000 Saulsbury/Spartan heavy rescue -- runs out of Station 2 on the city's east side. Windsor Fire & Rescue currently has two new stations under construction – a new Station 6 on Division Road not far from Windsor Airport and a new Station 5 on Northway Dr. near Huron Church Road. Pumper/Tanker #6 will likely move into the new hall before the end of the year, and Station 5 should be ready for occupancy in the first guarter of 2018. In surrounding Essex County, three fire departments have new Chiefs. Earlier this year, Chuck Parsons, formerly Chief of the Learnington Fire/Rescue took over as Chief of the Kingsville Fire Department. Tim Berthiaume, formerly with Windsor Fire & Rescue, was appointed temporary Chief in Learnington until a full-time chief is appointed in August. In April, Bruce Montone retired as Chief of Windsor Fire & Rescue. Just one week later he was hired as Chief of the nearby Amherstburg Fire Department. – Walt McCall

THE ELEPHANT'S GRAVEYARD – WHERE TORONTO'S 700S WENT TO DIE By Walt McCall

In the 1950s, through the 1960s and into the 1970s, the Toronto Fire Department's pumper and aerial fleet consisted almost entirely of American-LaFrance 700 Series fire apparatus. Between 1947 and 1958 the T.F.D. acquired 43 of these industry-leading cab-forward V-12 classics – second only to New York City.

At its peak, the T.F.D. roster included 25 ALF 840 gpm canopy cab pumpers, twelve open-cab 100foot aerials, two high pressure monitors and two rescue squads– plus an additional 700 Series open-cab pumper and 100' aerial annexed from Forest Hill. By the late 1960s the 700 Series pumpers, aerials, high pressure monitors and rescue squad (the 1947 squad had since been converted into a hose & booster car) were showing their age and were due for replacement. The TFD placed its first diesel-powered pumpers into service in 1970 and in 1963 had begun to swing away from custom-chassis fire apparatus to commercials – particularly the tilt-cab Ford C-Series. One by one the 700s began to disappear from the TFD frontline and spare apparatus roster until, by the late 1980s, they were all gone.

Where did they go? More than a few were traded in to Thibault and Pierreville on new tilt-cab International pumpers and aerials in the 1980s and headed east down the 401 to Quebec. There, most of the well-worn 700 series pumpers and aerials languished in the trade-in yard behind the Pierreville QC plants. Gradually stripped of parts and various sheet metal body panels, their rusting hulks were ultimately hauled off to local junkyards. Other ex-TFD 700's were stripped of suctions, ladders etc. and sold off at city auctions. With the exception of the two 1949 high pressure monitors – one of which was purchased by the OFBA -- and the 1949 rescue squad , the latter rescued and still owned by OFBA membership card #1 holder Harold McMann, very few have survived.

On my occasional visits to the Thibault and Pierreville plants, I always headed straight for the back lot were the trade-ins were parked. It was like visiting a cemetery, where once-familiar rigs were quietly and ignobly rusting away. And a look at The Golden Horseshoe through the eyes of a Welshman...

If my memory serves me right it was sometime in late 2016 when my wife and I identified that it was Canada's 150th Anniversary in 2017 – well the 2017 holiday location had been decided for us with that fact! By January we had chosen Ontario and Goderich in particular for the location for the Canada Day celebrations. Once the standard holiday worries were settled (flights, hire car, toddler car seat and hotels) I got down to working out the more interesting details – what fire departments would I get a chance to see! With the support of Facebook and various department pages I arranged to meet Desmond Brett and Ken Buchannan at the start and end of the holiday respectively and then in the middle to visit the Canadian Firefighters Museum (Port Hope) and to see Owen Sound F&ES to purchase two of their history books.

Don't worry, this isn't going to be a OFBA version of a holiday slide show, but I must say that those members living in Ontario live in a beautiful place with friendly people and some interesting fire trucks. So what photos I have included? A small selection from the locations noted above with a little commentary on each. I must thank Desmond and Ken for showing me (and in Ken's case my family too) around, the crews at the stations for moving the machines and showing a genuine interest in the fire service in the UK, the staff at the museum for their welcome and Chief Barlow of Owen Sound and his crew for their hospitality.



Desmond and I started our mini trip at City of Markham station 91, 7801 Bayview Drive. Here we saw the appropriately named pumper 911 seen resplendent in its anniversary livery in these two photos above and oppsite. This is a 2014 Spartan Metro Classic/Smeal 1750/500. (All photos by Paul Measday)





At the second of three Richmond Hill stations we visited, station 8-4, 1365 Elgin Mills Road East, we photographed this unusual tanker – a 2013 International Workstar/Spartan/Dependable (1250/1800). This has been converted from a pure engine a few years back.



Having spread the wings and driven east to Port Hope, my wife, son and I had a good look around the Canadian Firefighters Museum (above). Unsurprisingly with such a big collection it wasn't easy to photograph the vehicles but it was lovely to see a JOX aerial in the flesh for the first time. The photo below however is of an unusual 1935 Ford used for fire fighting within the walls of Kingston Penitentiary.
Although it has an engine, this is for pumping only and there is no drive train to prevent it being used in an escape attempt. Mindful of the insecure tenure at their current location, I have chosen to include a photograph of the main museum building to record it for posterity.





Having done a loop around Georgian Bay and a quick tour of Manitoulin Island we visited Owen Sound where the four main front line apparatus were pulled out for us to photograph. First up was Pumper 5 – I forgot to ask why the first away machine isn't number one – anyone know? This is a 2012 Spartan
Force/Crimson/Dependable (1250/835). Note it is marked up as Owen Sound Fire Department not Fire & Emergency Services. It is understood specifications for a replacement for this machine are being developed.



Aerial 3 was a great find – a now aging 1995 Spartan Gladiator/Novaquintech (1250/150) with 31m ladder. This machine certainly had a presence, necessitating me to cross the road to get a photo!



I have always had a soft spot for American La France vehicles having seen a pumper and tiller respond from a station in San Francisco back in 1988. The first of two seen in Owen Sound was marked as a pumper but also responded as a rescue – it is a 2007 Eagle model (1050/420).



The second American La France, second aerial and final vehicle I snapped at the Owen Sound station at 1209 3rd Avenue East was Aerial 4, a 2004 Eagle with 75ft LTI ladders (1250/420). Having purchased a copy of "Sirens across the sound" – a hardback book on the history of the department – I am looking forward to reading it and recalling our visit.



Photographs in a parade are never the best! However I thought it was worth sharing Goderich Fire Department's Pumper 11 – a 1999 International 4900/C-Max. This is one of three Internationals in the parade. Third fourth vehicle is an Emergency One ladder.



Seen about to depart after a call in the town the following evening was Goderich Fire Department's Rescue 12 - a 2003 International/Dependable.



The first of two "bonus" photographs not introduced in my preamble – Chatham-Kent's downtown station in Chatham was the scene for the new kid on the block – a 2017 Spartan Metro Star Classic/Dependable.



Again seen at the downtown station but from station two in the north west of Chatham is one of the department's pumpers – this time a 2001 HMPE 1871P/Fort Garry (1050/800).



So to the closing photos, the last few taken on a trip out with Ken. 17 Veterans Lane, Oshweken is the home of the main station of the Six Nations Fire & Emergency Services. PR1 is a 2010 Emergency One Typhoon (1250/800) with a fantastic black over red livery.

The final stop organised by Ken was to John C. Munro Hamilton International Airport where two crash rescue vehicles awaited us. First up was the newer machine, Red 1 is a 2009 Rosenbaur Panther.



Last in front of the cameras was Red 2 at the airport. This was a 2000 Oshkosh T1500.
