The Apparatus Floor....

Lincoln Tanker 626 currently running as Tanker 646 in Jordan until the New Station 2 is built in Campden. Current Tanker 446 is running out of Campden as the new rig will not fit in the current station 6-2. Ground breaking for the new Lincoln Station 6-2 in Campden occurred on May 2. (From Ken Buchahan)

Darch delivered the Six Nations tanker and Rama Pump 2 in shop from Pierce. They are expecting two pumper rescues for Woodstock and Pembroke in the next month. Last truck to come from Pierce is Cambridge's 100' platform which will be one of the most expensive trucks they have manufactured. Not sure what they ended up with other than it's a 2500 gallon tanker. That gives the township two 2500 gallon and two 1500 gallon tankers. The reason they kept the old New Dundee tanker and run it out of Baden is the water pressure in the hydrants in New Dundee is so low they can't use them.

Cambridge is looking for a tanker later in the year. Station six is slated to open in the fall, will get a shot of the station when construction is done. Not sure what truck will run there, possibly the new Pierce quint? I drove by Resqutech on Saturday after attending a funeral. They still have three Cambridge aerials out back, including the old Scot and the old Pierreville pumper. They are just rotting away sitting out in the elements. The old E1 platform would have been a good truck to pick up for a small department that needed an aerial, it was in decent shape and only saw one fire in the last ten years of service. (Gary Dinkel)

Following significant problems with the work being done, the Town of Caledon has dropped the contractor building the new hall in Bolton, which was supposed to have been completed last year. The 21,700 sq ft facility in nearly done, and has four bays for fire and two for ems. Final work is being done on the new halls for Minden and Perth East (Milverton). The Minden station has three bays and is located on Highway 35 next to the new EMS base. Given the damage to the old hall, it will likely be torn down.

Delta B.C. broke ground on April 15 for a new fire hall, training centre and emergency operation facility in Boundary Bay, at 80th and Churchill Streets near Boundary Bay Airport. Slated to replace Station 1 in Ladner, it is expected to open in May, 2019 and cost around \$9.6 million. More new Hub projects: # 1249 Malaspina, a Freightliner Pumper and # 1250 Malaspina, a Freightliner Tender, likely on two door FL M2 trucks and #1251, a Freightliner pumper going to Sauk'uz First Nation.

Opening this fall, Vancouver's new Firehall #5 will have 31 apartments above it for vulnerable women and their children. The plans call for three apparatus bays, architects illustration below, courtesy VFRS:

This contract is the first major supply agreement since Commercial expanded its Pierce territory to include the province of Ontario. The custom apparatus included in the city of Mississauga's initial order will feature six pumpers and one rescue pumper – all built on the Pierce EnforcerTM custom chassis. The four aerial apparatus included in the order are two 100' platforms, **Ascendant®** aerial а 75' quint, and 107' tandem axle ladder. rear

HISTORICALLY SPEAKING – WINDSOR'S SNORKELS By Walt McCall

In the 1970s and `80s, Windsor was almost unique among Ontario cities in having two aerial platforms on its fire apparatus roster. While several other cities – London, Oshawa, Burlington and Ottawa - purchased elevating platforms, or Snorkels, only Toronto and Windsor could boast of having two of them simultaneously in service.

Both of Windsor's towers were Hi-Rangers with 85' two-section, articulating-type booms mounted on Ford tilt-cab C-Series chassis. Of open-lattice construction compared with the box-section booms made by rivals Pitman and Trump, the Hi-Ranger was a product of Mobile Aerial Towers of Fort Wayne, Ind., the company that built Chicago's pioneering Snorkels in the late 1950s and `60s.

Built by Duke Equipment Ltd. of Burlington, Windsor's first Hi-Ranger was delivered on October 21, 1971 (I was actually in the hall when it arrived). Mounted on a tandem axle Ford CT-900 chassis with three-man closed cab, it was the first Diesel-powered apparatus on the W.F.D. Contract price was \$73,525. After extensive crew training Aerial Tower No. 1 was placed into service at Windsor's headquarters station on Goyeau St. in late November, 1971. It fought its first major fire in on Wyandotte St. E. in May, 1972, where it quickly earned the respect of its crews for its ease of operation and aerial mobility. Suddenly, it seemed, nobody wanted to climb an aerial ladder anymore....

Nine years passed before Windsor acquired its second Snorkel, a generally-identical Duke/Hi-Ranger 85' tower, also on tandem-axle Ford C-Series chassis, delivered in the spring of 1982. Windsor's second tower differed from its predecessor in having an extended canopy style crew cab, and while the `71 rig was the traditional fire engine red, the new Aerial Tower #2 was painted the trendy lime-green the WFD had switched to in 1974. When Aerial Tower #2 was placed into service at the headquarters hall on Goyeau St., Aerial Tower #1 was transferred to Station 2 on Richmond St., covering the east side of the city while Tower 2 covered downtown and the west side.

Aerial Tower 1 was repainted lime-green in the mid-1980s. Both served the city well performing rescue and water tower service at many major fires in Windsor, including the Walker road factory conflagration on June 30, 1985 and another huge industrial building fire on Edna St. two years later. In its twilight years, the 1982 tower ran as Tower 1 out of Station 6 on Tecumseh Rd. E.

The articulating-boom aerial tower era in Windsor came to an abrupt end when Windsor Fire & Rescue replaced its entire aerial fleet with five Sutphen Aerial Towers in 1998 – three 95-footers and two 70' minitower quints. After a short time as spares, the Hi-Rangers were retired and disposed of. The last we heard of Aerial Tower 2 was when it was impounded in Las Vegas for an invalid transit permit en route to a construction company in California. Aerial Tower #1 was on the WFD roster for an impressive 27 years, Tower #2 for 16 years.
